



## 10 Best Things to Know About the Library

### 1. How do I find books?

Use Pegasus, the UCSB Libraries catalog. You may also renew books online with your Pegasus account. <http://pegasus.library.ucsb.edu/F>. Use your Access card or student ID to check out books.

### 2. How do I find articles?

Use an article index. Expanded Academic is a great start. <http://www.library.ucsb.edu/eresources/databases/>

### 3. Can I do research from home?

Sure, you'll need to format your browser to access our Proxy Server. <http://www.library.ucsb.edu/proxy/>

### 4. Where can I use my laptop?

Wireless is available in these locations: most of the 1st and 4th floors, 2nd floor near the SEL computing area and around EGSL, 24 hour study room, 8th Floor Graduate Study Lounge, Arts Library. There are also tables in the 24-hour study room and on the 4th floor where you can physically plug your laptop into our network. To use wireless or plug into our network, you must be a university employee or currently enrolled student with a UCSBnetID.

### 5. How do I make photocopies or print from the computers?

Buy a copy card from the dispenser near the Reference & Information Desk, 1st floor or near the SEL desk, 2nd floor to make reduced price copies, 10¢ per page. You may also use change, in which case copies cost 15¢. Printing from computers in the library requires a copy card; cost is 10¢ per page.

### 6. Is there someone who can help me?

Stop at the Reference & Information Desk on the 1st floor to speak with a librarian or to make an appointment for a consultation. Ask questions through e-mail and our chat service,
